AICA-USA is the United States section of the Association Internationale des Critiques d'Art, which was founded in 1950 in Paris to revive the critical discourse that had suffered under fascism and the Second World War and to develop international cooperation in the fields of artistic creation and cultural development. At present there are sixty-three member nations representing more than 5,000 art critics. AICA-USA is pleased to present *Moving the Center*, the sixteenth annual AICA-USA Distinguished Critic Lecture at The New School, delivered by arts journalist Siddhartha Mitter. Siddhartha Mitter contributes primarily to *The New York Times*, where he writes profiles, features, and criticism on contemporary art. He is most concerned with art-making and culture work as they reflect, negotiate, imagine, and expand civic possibility. He works locally, nationally, and internationally, often in Africa. He was a regular in the *Village Voice* in its swan-song years and has contributed to many other publications within and outside the art field. Previously he was the culture reporter at WNYC New York Public Radio, and a writer on jazz and other music for the *Boston Globe*. Mitter's training was in the social sciences, including graduate work in the political economy of development. His roots are in Boston, Calcutta, and Paris, and he has lived in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn, since 2007.

The AICA-USA Distinguished Critic Lecture at The New School is an annual event during which an exemplary writer addresses seminal issues in contemporary art criticism.
